Which approach do you use in your everyday life?
- Where are you on your call to discipleship? (A) Not even tagging along (B) Hanging with the crowd in the back (C) Asking what it will take (D) Walking away because the cost is too high (E) Striving to fully follow.
- ❖ What are the greatest challenges to your discipleship right now?
- ❖ Has there ever been a time that you have "looked back" and have gotten off track in your walk? What were you looking back at? Why do you think it is often easier to "look back" than to focus on Jesus?
- After reading Luke 9:57-62, how would you answer the person who asked you, "What is a Christian?"

Pray Together- Use the ACTS acronym (Adoration, confession, thanksgiving, supplication)

This acronym helps us to praise God, confess our sins and ask for His forgiveness, thank God for the blessings He gives us, and ask Him for what we desire and need. Pray your way through the acronym and encourage everyone present to contribute to each section.
