Read Matthew 26, Mark 14, Luke 23, and/or John 13 Discussion Questions:

- 1. When was the old covenant established? What is the new covenant?
 - a. In the old covenant, God expected His people to live a certain way. He explained this covenant to Abraham in Genesis. God's people had broken the covenant over and over, so God in His mercy established a new covenant. The new covenant says that everyone who turns away from sin and trusts in Jesus' death and resurrection will be forgiven of his sins and have eternal life.
- 2. Why did Jesus instruct the disciples to take the bread and the cup?
 - a. Remembering Jesus' sacrifice in this way, we "proclaim the Lord's death until He comes."
- 3. What must we do to be saved through the new covenant?
 - a. Salvation isn't dependent on our works or deeds, if this was the case, none of us would have it! Jesus already lived a perfect life and died to pay for our sins. We get the free gift of salvation by trusting Him as our Lord.
